



Nobelity comes to Fremantle

NOBEL LAUREATE Barry Marshall presented the inaugural Warren Jones Oration at the Fremantle Hospital last Thursday.

A researcher at the University of WA, Prof Marshall was jointly awarded the Nobel Prize in medicine for his work that proved stomach ulcers were caused by bacteria

and not diet or stress.

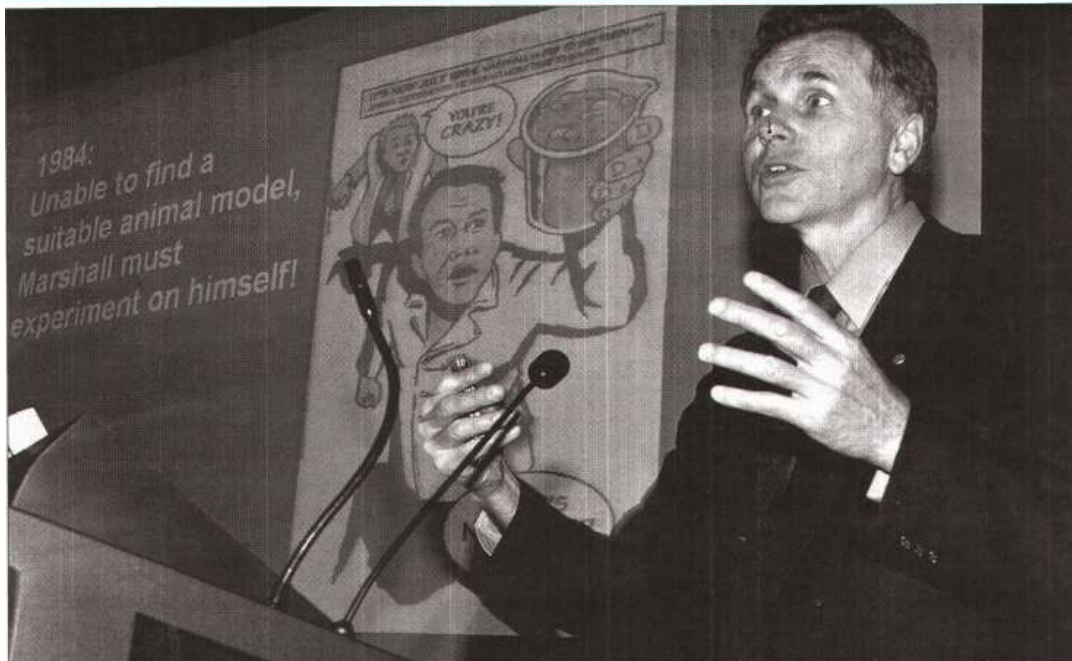
Much of the research was conducted in the Fremantle Hospital laboratories.

The oration is named in honour of Warren Jones, the Fremantle identity who is best known for his role in the capturing of the America's Cup.

Mr Jones was honorary

chairman of the board at the Fremantle Hospital and Health Service, where he was instrumental in the development of technical facilities and equipment.

He was also one of the driving forces behind the creation of the Fremantle Hospital medical Research Foundation in 1996.
